**Information Bulletins issued as Standata by Alberta Municipal Affairs  
Governing Gas and Pressure Equipment Safety disciplines on**  
**1) Liquefied Petroleum Gas Storage Installations in Residential and  
Commercial Applications,**  
**2) Fuel Gas Pressure Piping in Plants, and**  
**3) Propane Storage Tanks Designed for 200 psig**

The following Information Bulletins, issued as Standata by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs of the Government of Alberta, were jointly developed by Safety Services, both the Boilers and Pressure Vessels Sub Council and the Gas Sub Council of the Safety Codes Council and ABSA, and signed off by the Administrator of Gas Safety and the Administrator of Boilers and Pressure Equipment Safety as requirements for the specific equipment as indicated in the respective bulletin for use in Alberta:

This bulletin is issued to inform all those involved in the propane industry, including Accredited Inspection Authorities, Canadian Propane Association (CPA) members, propane suppliers, manufacturers and gas fitters/installers, as of the requirements associated with the installation of LPG (Liquefied Petroleum Gas) Storage Vessels in domestic and commercial applications.

- 2) Gas Safety Information Bulletin, Standata G-03-11-ABSA  
**Fuel Gas Pressure Piping in Plants**

This bulletin is issued to inform all Accredited Inspection Authorities, Gas utilities, Federation of Alberta Gas Co-ops, Canadian Propane Association (CPA) members, propane suppliers, commercial and industrial facilities as well as gasfitters/installers to ensure that designers and installers are aware of the provisions for fuel gas pressure piping above and below 15 psi (103 kPa).

**Propane Storage Tanks Designed for 200 PSIG**

This bulletin is issued to all Accredited Inspection Authorities, Canadian Propane Association (CPA) members, propane suppliers and gasfitters/installers to clarify the operation of the propane storage tanks designed for 200 psig in existing installations in the province and import of such tanks from outside Alberta is not acceptable for use in Alberta.
